Whereas, the Legal Concerns Committee was created three years ago at the 2012 national conference hosted at Duke University, and;

Whereas, because the stated responsibilities of this position also fall under the purview of the social justice, employment concerns, legislative concerns, and international student concerns committees respectively and;

Whereas, this position has provided limited productivity to the Association since its creation and;

Resolved, *that* Article VI, Section 4, item D and Section 7 of the Bylaws of the National Association of Graduate-Professional Students be removed from the bylaws, thereby eliminating the Legal Concerns Committee and Legal Concerns Chair position and;

Resolved, *that* a copy of this resolution be sent to the membership of the Association within 30 days of its passage.
