

What Congress Can Do to Help Attract International Talents

- 1. Support an amendment to <u>S. 386 / H.R. 1044</u>, the Fairness for High-Skilled Immigrants Act of 2019 that would prioritize applicants who have earned advanced degrees in the US:
 - a. Annually reserve half of all EB-2 visas for applicants who have
 - i. Earned advanced degrees from the United States and
 - ii. Have spent at least 5 years in the country.
- 2. Support and co-sponsor S.1744 Keep STEM Talent Act of 2019
- 3. Oppose attempts to <u>challenge</u> the <u>Optional Practical Training (OPT)</u> and support efforts to expand this program.
- 4. Investigate the increasing F-1 student visa and OPT processing delays.
- 5. Investigate the proposed 'Establishing a Maximum Period of Authorized Stay for Students, Exchange Visitors, and Media Representatives' and elimination of 'duration of status'.
